

MASTERS wants to promote apprenticeship in small and micro enterprises, developing and validating a set of practical and methodological tools to support the professional development of in company tutors operating in SMEs, VET trainers and job counsellors, so as to allow them to implement efficient and high quality apprenticeship programs.

MASTERS is a complex and ambitious project, with six concrete intellectual outputs generated by six partners from four countries. We have scheduled the project for 24 months implementation.

CURRENT SCOPE OF ACTIVITIES

We have finished with the development of **IO1** "In-depth analysis of WBL schemes at European level" which is available in our official website.

We are currently working in the elaboration of IO2 and IO3.

- **IO2**: Curriculum Programme development for in-company tutors (SMEs) involved in apprenticeships programs.
- **IO3**: Curriculum Programme development for the Job Counsellors/Practitioners (public and private sector) involved in apprenticeships programs.

In these intellectual outputs, a **common curriculum programme** for the professional development of each of the target groups (incompany tutors and job counsellors) will be designed, developed, and tested. These outputs have the objective of providing with the right **skills/competences** for managing and delivering high quality apprenticeships and developing new knowledge.
