
• Self-Revealing Tests: **Refinements Underway**

The MOOC

We are finalizing a self-paced **MOOC** (Massive Open Online Course) for youth workers. The course will include five modules covering key topics:

- Understanding unconscious bias and invisible racism
- Introduction to non-formal learning methodologies
- Theatre of the oppressed for youth work
- Storytelling as a tool for addressing bias
- Practical application of the LIGHT tools
